On January 20, 1942, Nazi leaders decreed at the Wannsee Conference that they would seek to destroy every Jewish person in occupied Europe. They launched the so-called “Final Solution to the Jewish Problem,” which would put existing concentration camps to an even deadlier use and require the construction of new killing centers.

"The Final Solution" and the Creation of Auschwitz

Extermination camps were killing centers designed to carry out genocide. About three million Jews were gassed in extermination camps. In its entirety, the "Final Solution" consisted of gassings, shootings, random acts of terror, disease, and starvation that accounted for the deaths of about six million Jews—two-thirds of European Jewry. The Final Solution It is not known when Hitler formed the intention of the “final solution of the Jewish question” on the scale of the European continent. The conference in Wannsee on January 20, 1942 considered only the details of the undertaking: the methods for organizing the deportation and ensuring the cooperation of the civilian administration.

The “final solution to the Jewish question” was unveiled by Reinhard Heydrich (who was Heinrich Himmler’s chief lieutenant in the SS) on 20 January 1942 at the Wannsee Conference. Fourteen top Nazis gathered at a villa in Wannsee, a Berlin suburb, to hear Heydrich’s plan.

Concentration Camps, 1933-39 During the first six years of the Nazi regime, thousands of Germans were detained or confined extra-legally. The conditions were usually harsh and there was no regard to the legal norms of arrest and imprisonment of a constitutional democracy in terms of arrest and imprisonment.

Following the Wannsee Conference in Berlin, January 20, 1942, Extermination Camps and the "Final Solution" became the Nazi regime's major obsession. Consequently, of the 6 million Jews murdered in the Holocaust, more than half were systematically exterminated in Nazi Death Camps between 1942 and 1945.

Otto Adolf Eichmann (/ˈaɪxmən / IKE-mən ; German: [ˈɔʏtə ˈaːdɔlf ˈaɪçmən]; 19 March 1906 – 1 June 1962) was a German-Austrian SS - Obersturmbannführer and one of the major organizers of the Holocaust —the " Final Solution to the Jewish Question " in Nazi terminology.

To more efficiently kill all Jews living in Europe as part of the Final Solution, Nazi Germany created six specialized extermination camps in occupied Poland. These camps functioned as death factories, where millions of people were shot, hanged, starved, tortured, raped, and poisoned in gas chambers through an assembly-line style of mass murder.
